CMS is committed to providing *Education and Outreach* opportunities about the quality measure development process to interested stakeholders to improve understanding of the process. CMS also seeks continual feedback to improve and/or expand its offerings to the healthcare quality measure development community and interested stakeholders.

To date, CMS has implemented an *Education and Outreach* webinar series and has created resource materials that break down and explain various components and challenges in the measure development process. There are dedicated websites, listservs, and roadmap documents that are available to support those that are working in quality measure development, or are just curious and want to learn more about how it is done.



This slide deck will delve into the major changes to the CMIT tool. One is the updates to the measure terminology which we believe to be more intuitive, while the CMIT IDs have undergone a change which is more userfriendly. Expanded is information to now include the CMS Innovation Center model and demonstration measures and integrated are the new Cascade of Meaningful Measures categorizations or framework to our measures.

CMIT contains a lot of details around the specifics for measures such as descriptions and their numerator and denominator. A lot goes into measure reporting for various payment and performance programs, and as such there are a lot of measure initiatives for which we remain as inclusive as possible.

Purpose of CMIT



CMIT Data

The CMS Quality Measures Inventory includes:

- CMS-related measures under development, under consideration, proposed, finalized, implemented, and removed
- Measures in Medicaid core sets, Medicare Star Ratings Parts C & D, Innovation Center models, Marketplace QRS, and Medicare quality programs including those for hospitals, post-acute care/long-term care settings, and clinicians

For historical purposes we do keep measures that have been removed from programs. Oftentimes within the measure information there are links to the actual federal rule where those decisions were made. Alternatively, there are links to the eCQI Resource Center to obtain more specific information on eCQMs, but ultimately the end goal is to provide the most up-to-date and current information for all of the different programs and their various stages in the measure development process.

CMIT Data Updates



Proposed and final federal rules—For those programs that use that formal rulemaking process, we try to update that data as it comes out on a rolling basis.

Measure specification and technical manuals—We follow any published CMS program documentation. So if a program doesn't go through that formal Federal Register rulemaking process but has an annual call letter, those are some examples of what documentation we may use.

Collaborate with CMS program leads—A key point about these data updates is that as we collect and synthetize this information and prepare to put it into CMIT by working with the CMS program leads to ensure they have validated that information.

CMIT Naming Conventions



Depicted on the *left* of this slide is the terminology we just covered as a part of the orientation to CMIT. To make the Inventory more userfriendly, we are proposing the terminology on the *right* to better describe exactly what each level of the data infrastructure represents to any user accessing CMIT.



Depicted on the *left* are the measures, the highest level of categorization.

In the *middle* are the different variations of measures. An example of why there are different measure variations include different care settings or different populations.

On the *right* are the program-specific versions, which is a customizable version of the measure variation assigned to a specific program. Examples of why there are differences include targeted age ranges, different data sources, or any other program-specific adjustments to that measure.

The updated CMIT ID is intended to be a simplified and consistent unique identifier of a program-specific version. From *left to right* are the measure ID, that largest categorization of the measures, followed by the measure variation ID, the format which signifies if the measure is a CQM/ eCQM. At the end is the program suffix that makes obvious which program is using which version.



Depicted here is how the new CMIT ID relates to the previous ID structure. The format and the program are consistent between both versions, with the addition of the new measure ID seen here in *purple*. It provides a stabilizing prefix to the ID, which provides a constant and better link to the measure and program-specific versions throughout the different programs.

Illustrated on this slide is a screenshot of how the IDs are structured within the CMIT landing site. Depicted in *red* are the differences in how the ID is structured. The new ID shown underlined under the program-specific version titles is made up of the different levels of the structure from *left to right*. The measure ID, 21, followed by the measure variation ID, either 1, 2, or 3, and making up the full CMIT ID on the right with the ending of the program acronym.

Integrating Cascade of Meaningful Measures categorization

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Understanding the Cascade

- The Cascade starts with the eight health care priorities of Meaningful Measures 2.0
- Provides a matrix for categorizing critical components of the health care system at increasingly granular levels of detail



The Cascade is a tool of operationalizing Meaningful Measures 2.0. The categories (i.e., goals and objectives) of the Cascade were developed by consulting peer-reviewed and grey literature, and through multiple rounds of stakeholder input. We used these sources to identify the goals and objectives that should be measured and then looked at the CMS portfolio to see how it maps onto these key building blocks of quality.

What is the Cascade of Meaningful Measures?



The Cascade is a tool for measure prioritization, supporting CMS's efforts to:

- Align or reduce measures where there are too many
- Identify gaps where new measures may need to be developed
- Help programs move toward aligning measurement with the Cascade's goals and objectives (e.g., through use of composites)

Cascade of Meaningful Measures Use

The incorporation of the Cascade of Meaningful Measures within CMIT will allow users to:

- · Easily identify measures within priority areas
- · Export or compare measures with similar goals
- · Prioritize measures in development and in use
 - Identify opportunities for measure removal and new measure development

On the *left* side of this schematic is a healthcare priority, which represents one of eight healthcare priorities of the Meaningful Measures 2.0. Each healthcare priority has multiple goals, labeled in *light blue* as "A, B and C." Each goal is supported by measurable objectives, depicted furthest on the *right*.

Certain measures, depending on their topic and specifications, may cross two Meaningful Measures 2.0 priorities, for which these measures will have a primary and secondary categorization in the Cascade.

Arrow at bottom of diagram—At present the majority of measures are easily mapped to the objective level. In the future we may shift to the left to more directly measure goals or even healthcare priorities.

Depicted here is a wireframe of how the filters of the Cascade of Meaningful Measures will be displayed using an *expandable menu* to select several different priorities at once. There is an option to view primary/secondary categorizations only, with the default filter including all options. As with current CMIT filters, the numbers in parentheses next to each category represent the number of program-specific measure versions that qualify in each categorization.

Viewing All Active Measures

- The default view is to display active measures for all programs and initiatives in the inventory.
- Active measures are defined as being included (i.e., voluntarily or mandatory) in data reporting to one or more CMS programs or initiatives



Using the CMIT Search Bar

- How-to best search:
 - Any Individual terms will be searched separately and return if any word is present
 - All Individual terms will be searched separately but only return if all are present in any order
 - **Phrase** The entirety of the phrase will be searched together. This method is preferred for searching CMIT IDs.
